This half-term we will be developing our understanding in all the Areas of Learning through the exploration of Ourselves and Autumn. If you have any books or artefacts at home that support these themes, and that your daughter may share with the class, do please send them into school with her.

- We will develop our language associated with the season of Autumn. Please encourage your daughter to look at the natural world outside. Help her to consider how the weather and temperatures are changing and why. Look at the flora around us, what is happening to the plants and leaves on the trees? Has anything changed? Do we eat different foods?

Autumn season change colder windy wet colour berries puddles spider webs falling leaves darker earlier at night acorns chestnuts conkers squirrels harvest

- We will continue to look at what we mean by labelling by naming various parts of the body, e.g. head, wrist and nose. We will also begin to write a simple sentence to accompany an outline of a girl, e.g. 'My toes can tap.'

Initial assessments will continue to be carried out next week so that we may support your daughter fully in her learning journey.

On-going :- Daily phonic reinforcement and writing development of letters, including Read, Write Inc work. We will look at the correct formation of **'x' and 'v'**.

Please note that when we write these letters we put an exit 'flick' on them.

We are **introducing** and **developing** our **sight recognition** of the high frequency words:-

I a am and can my
see the

Home/School Sharing Book: will be sent out **weekly on a Friday**.

Reading: will be delivered through books sent home at various times during the week, Read Write Inc texts and other texts delivered in class.

Word Lists: usually heard weekly

Library Book: This will be collected in every Tuesday and a new one re-issued.
